Précis of 100 Words or Less:	<p>The literature on corruption emphasized the deleterious effects of corruption on investment and economic growth. However, until recently few attempts has been made to elaborate the determinants of economic corruption. In this paper, we used a parsimonious specification including only few variables to explain cross-country differences of economic corruption. A negative and a significant relationship is found between corruption and education. It is negatively correlated with judicial efficiency and economic freedom, and is positively and significantly correlated with the size of government. The findings in the paper suggest that efforts should be directed to the establishment of good education, efficient legal systems, and smaller and decentralized government. It also implies that the role of the public sector as the most important source of wealth, prestige and status should be minimized.</p>
