Précis of 100 Words or Less:	Donors give more aid to corrupt governments. In Mozambique corruption grew rapidly in the 1990s as donors were prepared to tolerate corruption if the government rapidly adopted “market-friendly” policies. The Mozambican elite is divided, but the group which challenged high level corruption also criticised World Bank adjustment policies, so donors opted to support the corrupt faction that told the donors what they wanted. Donors stress institutional reform, which the corrupt faction bypasses. Finally, Mozambique’s reputation as one of the World Bank’s few success stories means donors are reluctant to besmirch that image by publicly raising the corruption issue.
