These include extortion racketeering, counterfeiting, fraud and public sector corruption. This research analyses 1] why these offenses should have risen following the peace process, and 2] the steps taken by law enforcement agencies to deal with these offenses.</p> <p>The research focuses upon the development of criminal and non-criminal strategies to control these offenses and the development of preventative mechanisms.</p> <p>The research focuses on law enforcement but covers other public sector organizations where relevant and police-private sector initiatives to control fraud and corruption.</p>
